Mar 31 - Apr 13: The Institute will be hosting 5th Graders from the Waynesboro School District Starting Friday, March 31st through Thursday, April 13th. Students will enjoy two programs, Monterey Peak Adventures and Civil War: Battle at Monterey Pass. They will hike to the Monterey Peak observation deck and learn about forest ecology and the geologic features surrounding them. They will also get an overview of the Civil War as well as the battle that took place at midnight along the Mason-Dixon Line in July 1863. Students will tour the museum, visit a Civil War-era garden, and experience hands on activities to learn about the everyday lives of the Civil War soldiers.

Apr 8 - Nov 12: Museum is open for 2023 Season (Every Sat & Sun, 10am - 4pm)

Apr 14 - 16: <u>Living History Weekend</u> - <u>Military Encampment</u>. Join the War Between the States Society as the 69th Pennsylvania and the 23rd North Carolina reenact camp life and battle. Units will be available Friday - Sunday to share camp life, the school of the soldier, and unit histories. Horse drawn wagon rides will be available all three days and a blacksmith will demonstrate skills. Saturday and Sunday will feature reenactments of the Battle of Monterey Pass.
