**Apr 3 - 19:** <u>Buttonwood Nature Center, Home of the Institute</u> will be hosting 5th Graders from the Waynesboro School District Starting **Wednesday, April 3rd** on weekdays through **Friday, April 19th**. Students will enjoy two programs, *Monterey Peak Adventures* and *Civil War: Battle at Monterey Pass.* They will hike to the Monterey Peak observation deck and learn about forest ecology and the geologic features surrounding them. They will also get an overview of the Civil War as well as the battle that took place at midnight along the Mason-Dixon Line in July 1863. Students will tour the museum and experience hands on activities to learn about the everyday lives of the Civil War soldiers.

Join the War Between the States Society as Union Cavalry Mounted and Dismounted units the 1st WV Cavalry and the 1st, 5th, 6th, and 7th Michigan Cavalry, face off against Confederate units the 1st MD Cavalry, the 5th AL Infantry, and the 5th, 12th, 20th and 23rd North Carolina Infantry to reenact camp life and the Battle of Monterey Pass. **May 11 - 1 pm: Civil War Trails Sign Dedication** at the corner of Charmian and Furnace Roads. The sign shares the role of 17 year old Henrietta "Hetty" Zielinger who aided Union forces pursuing the retreating Confederate wagon trains through Monterey Pass. The dedication features battlefield guide John Galie recounting the story from a site not far from Hetty's home in 1863, and ceremonial seven gun salute by members of the 2nd US Sharpshooters (2nd USSS).

May 11 – 12: Living History Weekend at the Battlefield Park: Join contemporary representatives of the <u>2nd United States Sharpshooters (USSS)</u> as they demonstrate Sharpshooter skills and techniques, and soldiers lives during the Civil War. **Jul 6 - 7:** Living History Weekend - <u>Thunder & Mud, A Preservation March</u>: Meet living historians as they recreate part of the Army of Northern Virginia's retreat from Gettysburg to the Potomac River, resulting in the Battle of Monterey Pass! This weekend will be special and in two parts.

<u>Saturday</u>, July 6th will feature a major event. Approximately 50 reenactors will march roughly eight miles of Gen Lee's retreat following the same Old Mariah Furnace Road used by Lee's wagon train, ending on the grounds of the Monterey Pass Battlefield Museum. They will marshal at the Fairfield PA Fire Department from 6:30 - 7:00am, and depart at 7:30am. Marchers will portray the 1st North Carolina Sharpshooter Battalion acting as rear guard to the Army of Northern Virginia's vulnerable supply train headed toward South Mountain and the safety of the Old Dominion. They will be issued food rations appropriate for the retreat from Gettysburg, and will use only equipment available during this period as documented from historical resources. Depending on a lot of factors, they expect to arrive at the Museum between 12 - 1pm. You can download maps of the original route and the reenactor's route which you'll find follows Iron Springs Road through to Gum Springs Road, and eventually to Old Maria Furnace Road.

(Note: If you go out along the route to see men marching in full Confederate uniforms with backpacks in the summer heat mixing with Saturday morning traffic, please use common sense. They will not need additional obstacles to overcome ;-)

- <u>Saturday, July 6, 0900 1700, and Sunday, 7 Jul, 0900 1400</u>: Complementing the march on the 6th, additional living historians will be available both days to offer interpretations of military camp life, medicine and local civilian life, and to answer questions. Saturday will also feature Infantry Demonstrations and Drills at 10:30am and 3:30pm. Sunday will add Military Camp Life Discussions with the 10th Mass.
