A Medical "Perfect Storm"

In a Civil War war ranging from Pennsylvania to Texas, millions of men battled with advanced weaponry, but little change in combat tactics. 720,000 killed, 476,000 wounded. Medical science has yet to discover germs. Two thirds of those who died did so because of disease. 51,000 casualties at Gettysburg alone, and then the Confederate retreat through Monterey Pass with Union forces in pursuit. No one was prepared for this perfect storm in medical care.

"<u>Civil War Historical Impressions</u>" reenactors and historians provide an authentic portrayal of a Union Field Hospital struggling with immense casualties in the War Between the States. Surgeons, nurses, hospital stewards, civilians, chaplains and infantry who serve as the "Ambulance Corps" demonstrate the daily responsibilities of caring for the wounded.

As an added bonus, professional tour guide John Galie will tell the story of the retreat from Gettysburg and the Battles that took place in raging thunderstorms all night around and right there at the Museum grounds on July 4 - 5, 1863. There will be two tours on Saturday at 11am and 2pm, and one on Sunday at 11am.
